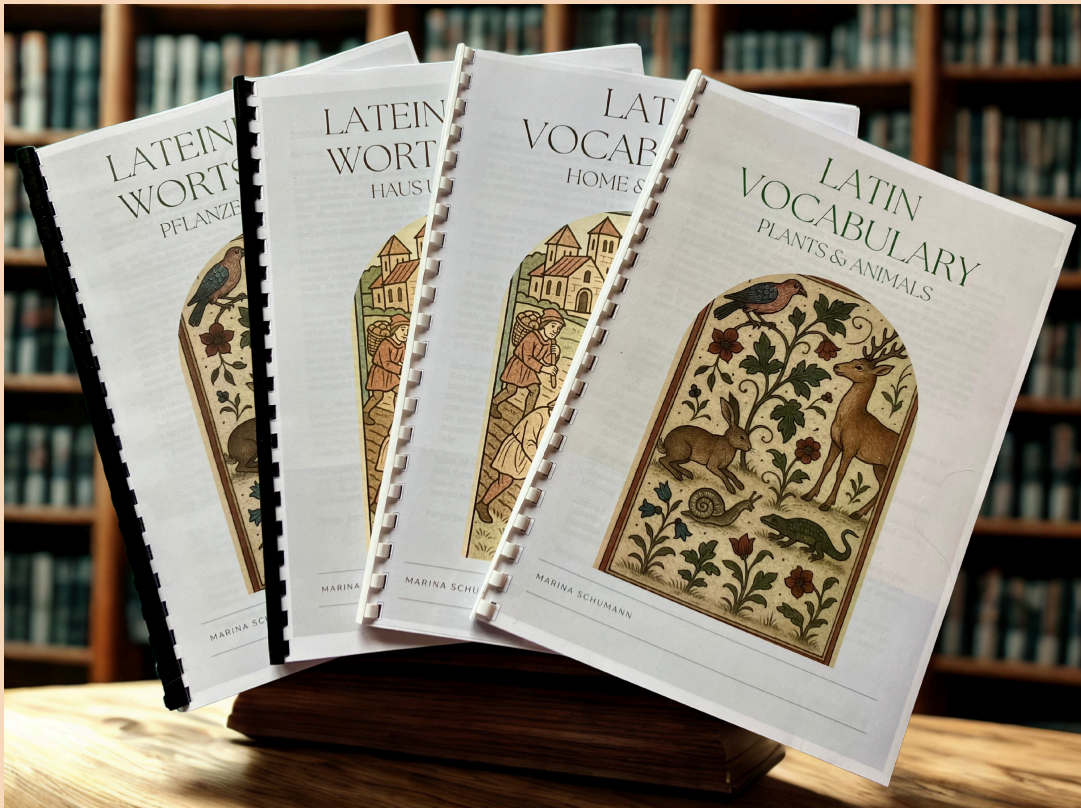


The biggest news this month: we're launching a Latin podcast!
